



Payroll Giving – Making Your Gift Go Further

What is payroll giving?

Payroll giving is a voluntary scheme for employers and employees helping you to support good causes in the most tax-efficient way by giving directly from your pay. Employees in participating companies donate to a chosen donee organisation that has Inland Revenue approved status. Northland Community Foundation is an approved donee organisation.

What does ‘an approved donee organisation’ mean?

We are registered with the Charities Commission and our registration shows that donations are a source of income. This registration has been approved by the Inland Revenue. You can check this out by going to: www.ird.govt.nz/donee-organisations/

What are the benefits of payroll giving?

For Northland Community Foundation: Payroll giving is an efficient, low-cost way to raise funds for the people of Northland.

For you as an Employee: Payroll giving makes it easier to give.

If you are donating through payroll giving you won't need to retain receipts and wait to file an annual claim form to get your donation tax credit. Each payday, when you make your donation through payroll you will receive an immediate 33.33 percent tax credit via PAYE on the donation. For example, if \$15 is donated, it will cost you \$10.00.

For an Employer: Payroll giving works for employers, employees and their communities. By enabling payroll giving, businesses demonstrate their commitment to their customers, clients and communities in a practical way.

How can I get my organisation to become involved in payroll giving?

Ask them! As an employer, they must choose to offer the payroll giving scheme to employees before any other steps are taken. The Trustees are happy to come in and talk to employers about the scheme and about the Northland Community Foundation.

The Northland Community Foundation

Northland Community Foundation has been created by the people of Northland for the people of Northland.

The goal is to provide a simple, effective and long-lasting way for people to give to local causes now and in the future, through a mix of endowment funds and carefully chosen projects. This ensures they meet the community's charitable needs and make the most of opportunities that will benefit the community now and into the future.

The Foundation is run by a volunteer board of nine Trustees. The Trustees are well-known, respected Northlanders who are committed to the region. Many have been active in their community for a number of years. As well as significant local knowledge, the board of trustees has expertise and experience in governance, commercial, legal, the public and rural sectors.

Project Promise

Project Promise and is being managed by the Northland Community Foundation and is a commitment to the people of Northland to raise the funds to build a new cancer treatment centre at Whangarei Hospital.

Our challenge is to raise \$3 million in 3 years and build a centre which will primarily be an ambulatory facility for the delivery of chemotherapy treatment and multi-disciplinary outpatient consultations. Services provided by the centre will reflect a holistic approach to cancer care. In this respect it will focus not only on medical and nursing treatment but services which support physical, emotional, cultural and spiritual wellbeing of patients and their families.

The planned cancer centre will greatly improve the treatment required for patients who live their lives through planning and phased care. However some patients will still have to travel to Auckland for some of their care, including radiation.

We all have a vision of the ultimate 'one-stop shop' and see Project Promise as the first phase of Northland's challenge.
